Fair Housing Review Board Helps Prevent Discrimination



The Worth Township Fair Housing Review Board, which consists of three members appointed by the Board of Trustees, meets to discuss issues that pertain to the Fair Housing Ordinance as well as to review and update policy as needed. The Board is charged with conducting hearings and adjudicating all complaints filed with the Township which allege a violation of the Fair Housing Ordinance. The Board, which has the power to make determinations and issue fines, is responsible for preventing discriminatory acts and unlawful housing practices within the Township.

- *Be honest with the different levels and degrees of violence within our Anger
- *Identify the trigger points of our Anger and consider the consequences of our action before we act
- *Develop a personal Anger Management Plan and follow through on its use
